WHEREAS, the term of this contract is intended to be for a period of one year with an option for an additional extension based upon a satisfactory review by the mayor and assembly of services provided, and subject to available funding,

RE: CONSULTING AND LOBBYING SERVICES AGREEMENT

Dear Haines Borough Manager

This letter will serve as a Consulting and Lobbying Services Agreement ("Agreement")

Effective as of January 1, 2015, by and between The Haines Borough and Thomas, Inc. ("Consultant"). This Agreement will terminate on December 31, 2016 or sooner as provided in this Agreement. Consultant will provide government relations services for The Haines Borough within the State of Alaska. Consultant will take direction from the Haines Borough designee, who will serve as Consultant's primary point of contact. The Haines Borough initial designee for purposes of this Agreement shall be The Haines Borough Manager. The Haines Borough may change its designee at any time by delivering written notice of such change to Consultant.

- 1. The scope of work to be performed by Consultant "(Work) specifically relates to government relations between The Haines Borough and the State of Alaska pertaining to The Haines Borough interests in Alaska. Consultant will cooperate with and coordinate Work activities with The Haines Borough designee.
- 2. Consultant's Work is subject to instructions received from The Haines Borough Manager in performing its services under this Agreement, Consultant will be and remain an independent contractor with control over the manner in which Consultant performs such services. Consultant will not hold itself out as an agent of The Haines Borough and will require that its officers, directors and employees refrain from holding themselves out as employees or agents of The Haines Borough. Consultant will be solely responsible for all compensation of its personnel and all federal, state and local employment taxes or other withholdings related to such compensation.
- 3. In exchange for Consultant's services under this Agreement, The Haines Borough shall pay Consultant an annual consulting fee of Forty-five thousand (\$45,000.00) during the term of this Agreement. Payment may be in lump sum or on a quarterly basis at the rate of \$11,250.00 annual quarter with the first such quarterly payment due upon execution of this Agreement and like payments due within the first thirty days of each calendar quarter.
- 4. In addition to the compensation payable under Section 3 of this Agreement, The Haines Borough shall also reimburse Consultant for its actual expenses incurred in providing services under this Agreement. To substantiate such expenses, Consultant shall submit an explanation of the purpose for and copies of receipts for: APOC fees, airline tickets (coach class except for transoceanic flights, then business class), car rentals, lodging, meals, phone bills, reproduction costs and postage. Consultant's subcontractor costs, if any, shall be incorporated in the above monthly billings. The Haines Borough shall reimburse Consultant for all

- such expenses within thirty (30) days after receipt by The Haines Borough of Consultant's billing for such expenses.
- 5. The Haines Borough or Consultant may terminate this Agreement at any time for any reason (or for no reason) upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party, without liability or penalty to either party. The cancellation or termination of this Agreement will not affect The Haines Borough's obligation to pay the compensation, due Consultant as of the termination date (which shall be at least 30 days after the date of any termination notice) and to reimburse Consultant for any expenses incurred as of that date.
- 6. Consultant shall complete the Work in accordance with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, administrative directions, and orders. Consultant shall not pay any commission, fee or rebate, or make any gift of significant value to any employee of The Haines Borough or regulator in connection with this Agreement. During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall comply with and abide by all lobbying, ethical, registration, or notification requirements under Alaska law or such other jurisdictions applicable to Consultant and shall comply with and abide by all lobbying, ethical, registration or notification requirements under Alaska law or such other jurisdictions applicable to The Haines Borough.
- 7. Consultant acknowledges that it may receive from The Haines Borough certain non-public information in connection with this Agreement. Consultant shall and will require its directors, officers, employees, and representatives to (1) treat such information as confidential, (2) not use any such information except for the purpose of performing the services contemplated by this Agreement, and (3) not disclose to any third party such information, except as may be required by law or legal process or as authorized by The Haines Borough in writing. All files, documents, and other property of whatever nature made available to Consultant by The Haines Borough will remain the property of The Haines Borough and will be surrendered by Consultant to The Haines Borough promptly upon termination of this Agreement. The obligations of Consultant under this Section & will survive the termination or cancellation of this Agreement.
- 8. During the term of this agreement, Consultant shall not provide services to or acquire any interest in a competitor of The Haines Borough (except for an interest not exceeding 1%, acquired for investment purposes, in a company whose stock is traded on a public exchange) without The Haines Borough's prior approval.
- 9. Consultant shall retain ownership of all copyrights and other rights in and to any reports, analyses, or other original works authored by Consultant pursuant to performing services under this Agreement and no such work shall be considered a work make for hire under the Copyright Laws of the United States. Consultant hereby grants to The Haines Borough a limited, non-exclusive, non-transferable

- license to use, for The Haines Borough's own purposes, all such works created by Consultant in performing this Agreement.
- 10. Consultant shall not advertise or otherwise use its contact with The Haines Borough under this Agreement in any public disclosure without prior written consent of The Haines Borough. Such disclosure shall include, without limitation, issuing brochures, listing references, placing advertisements and making any announcement or releasing any information to any third party concerning the existence or content of this Agreement, the Work or any facility of The Haines Borough. Consultant shall not use or permit the use of the trade or service names, marks or logos of The Haines Borough in any manner. This provision shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.
- 11. This Agreement and the documents incorporated herein constitute the complete agreement and supersede all prior agreements or understandings, written or oral, between the parties, with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement shall not be assigned by Consultant without prior written consent of The Haines Borough.
- 12. No provision of this Agreement shall be deemed waived without express written notice of waiver. Failure to demand strict performance in one instance shall not be deemed to waive either Party's right to insist on strict performance in any other instance.
- 13. The parties shall resolve any disputes arising under this Agreement through binding arbitration pursuant to the Alaska Revised Uniform Arbitration Act, Alaska Statutes 09.43.300-09.43.595. Any arbitration hearing shall be held in Haines Alaska, with parties bearing their own costs.

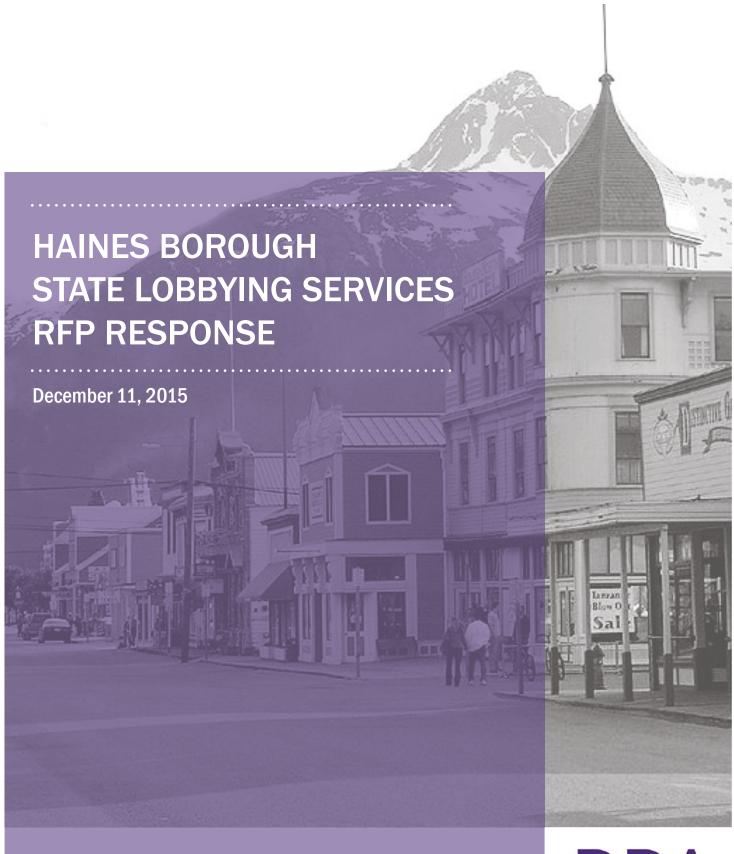

Denali Daniels & Associates (DDA) is pleased to offer this proposal to provide state lobbying services to the Haines Borough. Established in 2012, the team at DDA provides clients with traditional lobbying services combined with strategic capital project planning and public involvement services. This unique approach has resulted in the passage of major legislation, and we believe this sets us apart from other lobbyists. Our team consists of four seasoned professionals based in Anchorage with a presence in Juneau during legislative session.

PROJECT APPROACH

We believe that a successful legislative strategy requires an effective lobbyist that can also provide facilitation, communications and capital project planning support to compliment the traditional lobbying contract. Our proposal includes a full-service approach to include these supporting activities.

For example, we encourage a facilitated strategy session that results in a concise 12-month action plan complete with delegated assignments and a tactical implementation document for tracking purposes. The interim is often a lost opportunity for legislative advocacy – it can be the best time to reach legislators because they are more accessible. Some of our best work can occur during the interim, setting the stage for a smoother legislative session, which is why a 12-month plan is helpful.

Communications, both internal and external, are a critical component to achieve successful outcomes. Internally, leaders must receive regular communications and calls to action. Externally, support with media relations and stakeholder involvement ultimately help legislators defend their decision-making. In our experience, development of social media or print materials are helpful elements to the strategy. Lastly, having experience navigating capital funding processes can be critical. All of these services are offered under our proposal.

HAINES BOROUGH PRIORITIES

Though the 2016 legislative priorities will be determined at the upcoming December Haines Borough Assembly meeting, we went ahead and reviewed previous year priorities to get a sense of the support needed through this contract. Two major projects seem to continue to need funding:

- 1) The wastewater treatment facility, and
- 2) The Lutak dock facility.

Governor Walker released his State Capital Budget on December 9, 2016. The Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Municipal Water, Sewage and Solid Waste Matching Grant program included \$0 in the Governor's budget. The State of Alaska Municipal Harbor Grant program included \$5 million.

Also this week, the President signed the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (the FAST Act). The Act includes \$305 billion for transportation, and \$4.5 billion dedicated to freight infrastructure. It is expected that funding will be competed by state governments for local projects.

As the Haines Borough proceeds in advancing its priorities, our team can help with strategic discussions relating to capital project development. For example, if the Lutak dock facility cannot be fully funded, can the project be phased utilizing any available funds? If the federal FAST Act funding becomes available six months from now, would missing a construction season impact the project budget? For the wastewater treatment project, if we legislatively were able to get the funding back into the state Capital budget, could the Haines Borough be prioritized in the next round since it was so close this last time?

These are all hypothetical questions we would pose knowing very little about the project history, and we'd get up to speed on issues like this in the early stages of our contract with the Haines Borough. The team at DDA has extensive experience working through the various levels of bureaucracy to negotiate on your behalf.

March - April 2016	• At this point, more will be known about potential session outcomes and necessary strategy, and this part of the timeline will be updated in both weekly and monthly reports.
May 2016	 In person strategy session in Haines to debrief on session outcomes and develop interim legislative strategy. -DDA can provide facilitation and logistics support if requested. Weekly meetings go to monthly updates.
May - December 2016	Implement interim legislative strategy. Monthly updates.
October 2016	• 2017 Session strategy developed.

This draft timeline is an example of how we could frame your legislative strategy and track progress. Once we are on board and can hear more about the details of your priorities, this can be an ongoing tool to plan and track progress.

In 2012, the American Massage Therapy Association-Alaska Chapter (AMTA-AK) hired Denali Daniels to assist with legislative strategy and lobbying. During that time I served as legislative chair for the Alaska chapter of the American Massage Therapists Association (AMTA-AK) and chair of the statewide coalition that we developed as a means for carrying out our legislative strategy.

Though our goal was to pass a licensing bill for massage therapy in Alaska, we knew it was a tall order. For one thing, it meant suggesting a conservative legislature create more government. To make matters worse, we didn't have a good sense of how much support we had amongst ourselves and faced several specific concerns about the impact of licensing. We started to hear push back from legislators on whether the bill could be passed.

Denali led our leadership through discussions about timing of legislation. While we were initially anxious to get the bill moving in the 2013 session, after considering the potential opposition from some of our own members, we decided to instead host a series of public involvement meetings to hear what issues were of most concern. Denali helped us get a draft of a potential bill that we could circulate for membership comments. Her team assisted us with a membership survey that demonstrated significant support for licensing, and narrowed down key concerns that we could address in bill language. By the 2014 session, we had the consensus we needed to move forward with momentum.

Once session began, Denali assisted in critical discussions with house leadership, and our sponsor was strategically selected by leadership as a means to support a new house member in successfully sponsoring his first bill. House majority members decided to sign on as co-sponsors, and committee chairs helped move it along. A companion bill was sponsored in the Senate to keep things moving. In the end, House Bill 328 passed the House unanimously and the Senate 19-1.

During that session there were several bills having difficulty moving through the process. With Denali's strategic thinking, coaching of our members, relationships and positive reputation in Juneau, we got what we needed. The massage licensing board is now up and running and I'm pleased to serve as the board chair implementing the bill that we passed.

About Haines Borough

Re: Hiring a Lobbyist for 2016

Dear Haines Borough Assembly Members,

We recognize the Borough's need to secure additional funding to move closer to completion on several important projects, however, we do not believe hiring a lobbyist will generate the funding results desired given Alaska's current political and fiscal realities. We strongly urge you to postpone filling the lobbying position included in the 2015 budget for the following reasons:

- 1. The price of oil is now down to \sim \$40/barrel and is not expected to rise significantly for several years. Alaska is facing a multi-billion dollar budget shortfall and the Legislature will be cutting rather than expanding funding for projects and communities statewide.
- 2. The Anchorage/Mat-Su legislators controlling the majority caucuses in the Legislature have a very negative attitude towards Southeast Alaska communities, as demonstrated by their lack of support for basic infrastructure needs such as the Alaska Marine Highway.
- 3. Representative Kito and Senator Egan will be aware of the opportunities for influencing the Legislative and Gubernatorial budgets and will let us know when we need to send a local contingent to Juneau. A small, well-prepared, politically diverse group of citizens will be far more likely to sway key Legislators and the Governor, who are often far more receptive to an approach from the "real people" of a community as opposed to a "hired gun."

For the past several years, many people in Haines have been concerned about the repeated, significant expenditure of tax dollars on projects and studies that have provided limited if any benefit to the community. Spending \$45,000 on a lobbyist in this political and fiscal climate will be remembered as yet another costly, unproductive expense.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

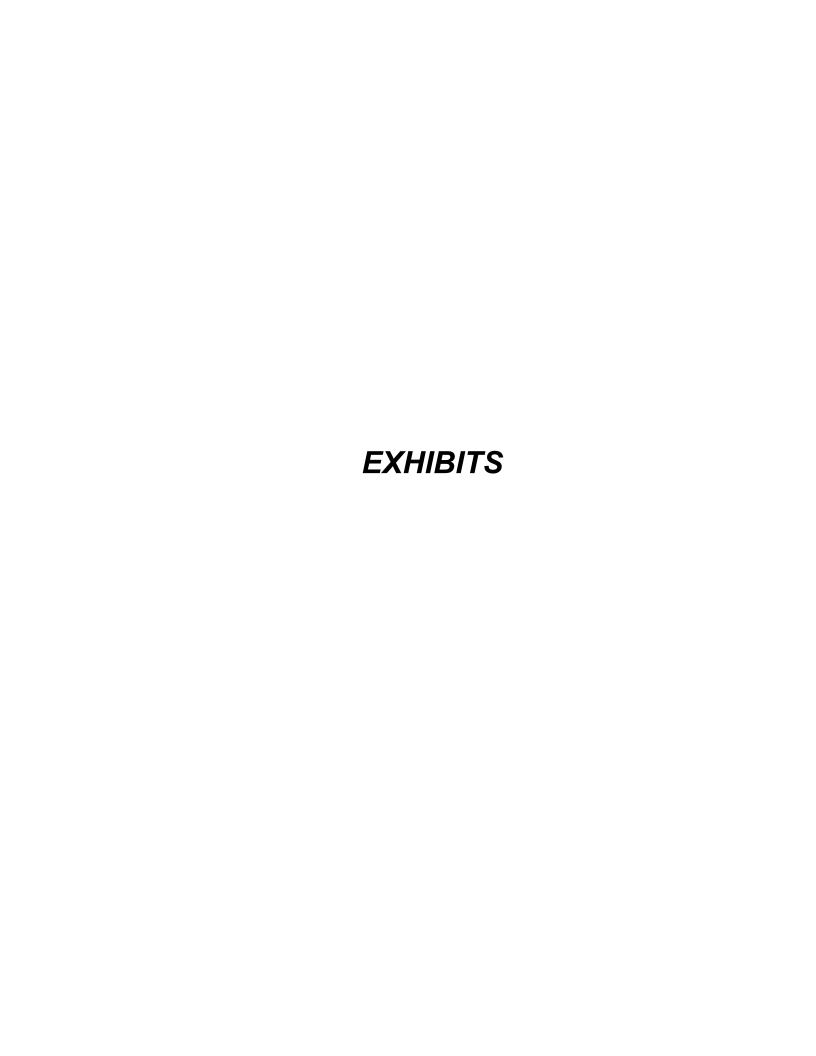

Expenses
