The 2018 Season was difficult due to weather and snow conditions. Only 37.5% of allocated skier days were used, and the season cut short voluntarily for lack of opportunity.

#### 2. Permit infractions and response

Five dates of operation by AK Heliskiing and AK Mountain Guides each and four dates of operation for SEABA were spot-checked.

No permit infractions or violations were identified.

Alaska Mountain Guides self-reported a minor infraction – flying an hour before allowed time – on Saturday, April 7. This was noted on their bi-weekly report.

A condition to document servicing helicopter communications equipment was made in response to the discovery that weak signals caused by weak electronic connections could be responsible for reporting erroneous data.

#### 3. Allowances

As allowed by HBC 5.18.080 F (2) permission was granted to Alaska Mountain Guides to begin operations at 6:30 am from the Haines Heliport and at 7:00 am from 10 mile, 18 mile, 33 mile and 35 mile Heliports from April 13 through April 21.

#### 4. Complaints and Comments

No complaints were received during the operating season.

A citizen recommendation was made for amendment to "Agreement Regarding Flight Operations and Practices of Commercial Ski Tours" to acknowledge the 35 mile Heliport and identify flight routes.
