# Portage Cove Harbor Expansion Budget Breakdown

The Portage Cove Harbor Expansion project base bid work consists of harbor basin dredging, steel pile supported wave barrier, moorage pile replacement and upland parking area. Additive Alternate A, B and C include additional dredging within the existing inner harbor; sacrificial pile anodes; and wave barrier extension and additional basin dredging, respectively.

The Borough recently issued a request for sealed bids from qualified, licensed contractors for the project and obtained six responsive bids. Pacific Pile & Marine was the low bidder, with a bid of \$13,202,938, including all three additive alternates. This work would be the first of four potential phases of the harbor expansion project. Below is a summary of funding and projected costs for each phase.

#### Phase I

Initial Funding: \$19.5 million from FY13 Designated Legislative Grants for Haines Boat Harbor and Breakwater Improvements and Boat Harbor Upgrades
Expense to Date: \$2.9 million (reported to grant agency through 9/30/16)
Pacific Pile & Marine Bid: \$13,202,938 (includes \$500,000 contingency)
Estimated Administration/Contract Oversight Costs: \$1 million

Estimated Additional Contingency Costs: \$500,000

Total Estimated Cost: \$17.6 million

Estimated Grant Funds Remaining Following Phase: \$1.9 million

## <u>Phase II – Sport Boat Launch Ramp</u>

**Estimated Cost:** \$4.6 million

The current estimate is \$3.2 million with additive alternates of \$1.4 million. The Haines Borough has a verbal agreement with the Alaska Department of Fish and Game to fund Phase II contingent upon an agreement between the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and Fish and Game.

<u>Phase III – Approach Dock, Gangway and Moorage Floats</u> Estimated Cost: \$4.7 million

## Phase IV – Drive Down Float

**Estimated Cost:** \$5.9 million

There is no priority associated with whether Phase III or IV should happen first. Borough staff recommends prioritizing phases based upon available grant funding and/or community priority.

#### Total Estimated (Phase 1-IV) Cost: \$32.8 million

The Designated Legislative Grants and Alaska Department of Fish and Game funding add up to an estimated \$24 million. With that funding in place, the Borough would need:

An additional estimated \$2.8 million to fund Phases I through III; OR

An additional estimated \$8.7 million to fund Phases I through IV.

If Phase I came in on budget without the need to use contingency funding, the Borough's necessary funding would be reduced by \$1 million.
