It is likely that all of us in Haines want a workable dock, but many of us want one that suits only our needs, our pocket book, our environment and doesn't allow for ore transfer. Based on the last election results, it appears the majority of voters are in that camp.

From the beginning, the desire for a non-mega dock was a clear message to the previous assembly and planning commission both in voluminous written and oral testimony. The current assembly had nothing to do with the current fiasco of the MARAD/Haines Borough Lutak Dock negotiations. It is ugly to watch.

It is hard to do the right thing when so much invective is coming your way, but I hope this assembly will try to carry on and do its best to make sure that Haines doesn't end up with a mega dock that it cannot afford and doesn't need. Please make sure that MARAD is provided with a viable, affordable and suitable alternative design for the Lutak Dock
