

Haines Borough Critical Infrastructure Plan of Protection (POP Form)

The Haines Borough has received more than 13 proposed Plans of Protection from contractors and other critical infrastructure businesses seeking to work in the Haines Borough. The following POP form has been created to guide the creation of the plan.

Subsistence Fishing- the Hooligan are coming!

Fishing or hunting is permitted even with the “Shelter in place” mandate but social distancing rules still apply. Keep a distance of six or more feet between individuals not in the same household.

Positive COVID-19 test at Lemon Creek

The SEARHC Clinic has received an update from the Alaska Section of Epidemiology that the Lemon Creek guard who tested positive for COVID-19 was unlikely to have had any contact with the local Haines Borough residents.

Burn Ban in effect Statewide as of May 1, 2020

The use of burn barrels, the burning of debris piles, and any other outdoor burning activity authorized under previously issued permits will be prohibited on all state, private and municipal lands throughout Alaska as of May 1. Any person or business found to be violating this burn permit suspension order may be issued a citation to pay a fine or appear in court.

This statewide burn permit suspension will not include cooking, warming or signaling fires that are less than three feet in diameter with flame lengths no more than two feet high. It also will not include commercially manufactured outdoor cooking and heating devices with built-in open flame safety devices.

School Facility Closed to Students for the Year (doesn't mean there is no school!)

**Reminder – Closure of the School facility does not mean there is no school. Distance delivery education via remote learning continues through the end of the school year. The Haines Borough is continuing to provide lunches to students.
