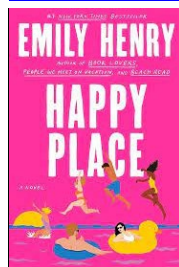
Story Walk Returns for the Summer

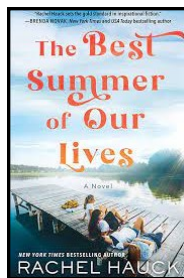

The Best Summer of Our Lives by Rachel Hauck

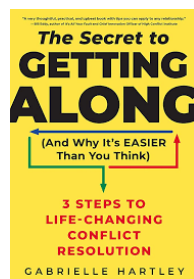

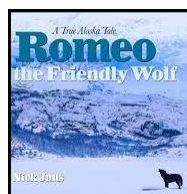
