Accessibility



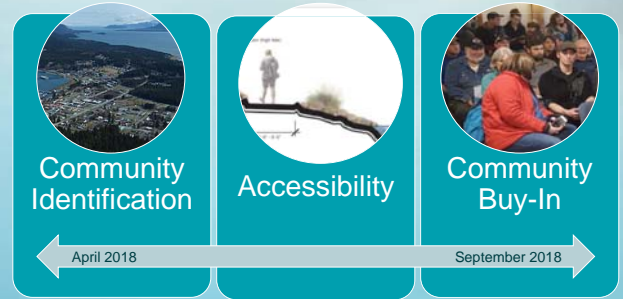
- Action 1 – Identify Users of the Trail
